## PREPARE

Preparation must be done *BEFORE* the event and should be based on best practices. This allows you to focus.



## RECOGNIZE

Quickly recognizing the scene type and scope. CBRNE scenes can be extremely dangerous. Avoid rushing in before IDENTIFYING hazard level, zone and PPE levels.



## INPUT

Identify scene “Cues and Clues”. These are important puzzle pieces of the much larger incident picture.



## MONITOR

Equipment is merely a tool and can only give you part of the picture. It is only as good as the knowledge and skill of the user. Ultimately, your BRAIN is your best tool.



## EXPERIENCE

Experience is vital, but should be based on tested street truth from other events and then actually LEARNED. Only then can this be integrated into response habits.

## DECISION

The final but most important step. HAZMAT/CBRNE incidents though overwhelming, have common patterns. If these are recognized early, it can help pave the way to safer decision making under stressful conditions.
